- II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES from January 2010 meeting: Corrine Gunkle made a motion to approve minutes as amended; seconded by Bill Hayes. Approved as amended. (February meeting was cancelled)
- III. NEW BUSINESS/ PRESENTATIONS / REPORTS
  - A. Leah Christman read a memo from Kristen Lewis updating the committee on the Early Entrant Screening Process.
  - B. Advanced Placement Courses, Class Rank, and GPA
    - 1. Joan Takacs presented data collected on student performance in AP History.
    - 2. A letter from a Southern Lehigh parent relaying her daughter's experience with AP courses and AP exams was shared.
    - 3. Committee discussed the merits of taking an AP course with the exam vs. taking the AP course without the exam. Concerns were:
      - Does the rigor of the course go down with the students?
      - · Who takes the course without taking the exam?
      - What is the incentive to take the exam?
      - How do we encourage more students to take the exam?
    - 4. Input from visitors
      - Some students value the course, but elect not to take the exam.
      - Some colleges do not accept AP credits.
      - Some parents value the pre-requisites and rigor of the courses.
      - Parents should make the decision to take the exam, not the school.
      - Some students may not understand the value of the exam to colleges.
      - If the district switches to an unweighted GPA, then there may be more benefit to taking the exam.



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- Disincentive to take unweighted electives, arts, and gifted courses because of GPA and class ranks.
- Teachers should discuss with the student the benefits of the exam.
- In some districts, all 10<sup>th</sup> graders take the PSAT indicating AP potential.
- District should consider financing the cost of the exams.
