- Congratulations to Mr. Colelli and the Technology Student Association students for qualifying for national competition with their wins at the State TSA State Leadership Conference recently held at Seven Springs. Two juniors placed first overall in the Video Game Design event. They are now back-to-back state champions. Two freshmen placed second in the same event. These four qualify for the National Leadership Conference in Orlando, Florida in June. Two other students placed in the top 10 in both CAD events, Architectural CAD and Engineering CAD. Additionally, Mr. Colelli was informed by the state TSA coordinator at the Department of Education, that our TSA chapter has been nominated for the outstanding chapter in the state of Pennsylvania. This award will be given out at the national conference.
- Congratulations to Mrs. Organski and the Future Business Leaders of America students for qualifying for national competition with their wins at the State FBLA State Leadership Conference also recently held at Seven Springs. Nikos M. finished 1st in his category of Hospitality Management. The team of Thomas S. and Somanpreet S. finished 5th in their category Marketing. Also, the club received an award for the highest per capita contribution to this year's state charity project of the Pennsylvania Trauma Society. Nikos' #1 finish also qualified him for the national competition so he will be competing not only in the FBLA event for Life Smarts along with Thomas, Felicia and Ciara, but he will also be competing in the Hospitality Management event as an individual.
