Mr. Kratz reached out to us through the Lehigh County WIB after hearing the presentation on our STEM programs at LCTI from Dr. Donahue and Mrs. Cooper. Bracalente is very interested in working with the school district to promote manufacturing and many related careers with our students. Bracalente produces highly engineered parts for a variety of industries at their local plant along with one in China including the space industry, automotive, and medical fields. Mr. Kraft and his team gave us a tour of the facility and offered teacher and student tours, speakers to our schools, and other ideas to partner with us. We are looking forward to exploring the partnership further in order to educate our students of the many options for careers that are available to them.
- Dr. John Draper former head of Educational Research Services in Washington DC visited with our staff today and his message was well received. Critical Conversations- (the title of his talk) outlined some of the statistics that are readily shared in the media along with the truth behind the messages. He talked about misperceptions about public school along with possible reasons. Dr. Draper passionately shared the importance of public education, the positive messages that we <u>all</u> should share about our schools and educators, and the benefits of public education to students and our country as a whole. Dr. Draper also spoke to some of our local business leaders who were invited to a luncheon at the Intermediate School. Our business leaders also enjoyed his talk and expressed gratitude for the

invitation. As a follow-up to Dr. Draper's visit, we will be starting a new *Successory* program. Students will have an opportunity to write thank you notes to adults in our system in order to celebrate our many successes.

 Thanks to the Southern Lehigh Education Foundation and the hard work of our nursing staff, all of our classrooms will soon be equipped with emergency supplies to be used in the case of an extended lockdown. The emergency buckets contain bottled water, first-aid kits, tarps, toilet paper, hand sanitizer, trash bags and other amenities. The nurses unveiled the kits at our assembly today with a little humor and then worked together this afternoon to assemble the kits, which will be delivered to the schools this week.





• All of our Southern Lehigh buildings will be participating in national Shake Out day this Thursday, October 16. National Shake Out day is an opportunity for organizations to practice preparation for emergencies such as earthquakes. The drill
