Books needed:


- · Baby board books,

- On Nov. 11-13, I attended the CLIU Superintendent Leadership Retreat. Sessions presented by quest speakers included:
 - Updates from legal counsel on considerations in using software apps
 - o Q & A from Secretary of Education, Pedro Rivera
 - Managing the media- CCIU Dir. of Communications
 - Updates from legal counsel on labor relations and negotiations
 - National educational policy review- AASA
 - State policy and budget review- PASA
 - o CLIU budget presentation- CLIU staff
- Lutron and Discovery Education sponsored a workshop on November 18 that Mrs. Siegfried and I attended that focused on STEM and how schools can integrate 21st century skills in all content areas. Dr. Cindy Moss, Discovery's Global STEM Consultant referred to STEM as "Students and teachers energizing minds" and she discussed the STEM in careers, rather than STEM careers. A panelist of young professionals at Lutron shared their experiences from k-12 that helped them and shared other things that would be been beneficial. Most of the areas lacking revolved around 21st century skills related to communications, problem-solving, student-centered activities, and the integration of technology- all areas that we are promoting at SLSD. The workshop was very informative and we have plans to share more on this with our educators across the district.
