


Superintendent's Report

- The Middle School and JPL Intermediate School are running "Hour of Coding" events on December 9 after school for students to celebrate Computer Science Education Week. This international event is designed to introduce students to computer science and demonstrate that anyone can learn the basics of coding and to encourage 21st century skills including problem solving, creativity and innovation.
- We held our first meeting of a newly formed District Data Team committee on Nov. 5 with representatives from all levels. The purpose of the committee is to identify practices currently used to analyze student performance data across the district in order to standardize best practices to meet the instructional needs of all students. We anticipate meeting a few more times, after which information will be shared with building leaders. As more and more assessment data has become available, we continue to work with our educators to better understand practices and strategies that may help student specific goals.
- We held the first Superintendent/Parent Communication Council meeting on Nov. 2, 2015. Leaders of the parent organizations throughout the district meet with the superintendent 3-4 times each year to discuss issues impacting the district and to allow parents to bring issues or concerns they may have.
