- John McDonald, has been selected for the Middle School TEEAP/ITEEA Teacher of the Year Award. "The Teacher Excellence Award is one of the highest honors given to Technology and Engineering Education classroom teachers on the elementary, middle, and high school levels. It is presented in recognition of outstanding contributions to the profession and to students. Candidates for the Teacher Excellence Award must be characterized as providing technology and engineering education instruction of high quality, learner centered and relevant to a study of technological literacy. The Teacher Excellence Award provides public recognition on a local and state level through TEEAP (Technology & Engineering Education Association of Pennsylvania) and is presented at the Annual TEEAP Conference. In addition, the recipients name and application materials are forwarded to ITEEA (International Technology and Engineering Educators Association). The honoree is then also formally presented with an engraved plaque and other recognition at ITEEA's Annual National Conference."
- Congratulations to Mrs. McGinniss, our Health and Wellness Teacher, and the Southern Lehigh Middle School H.P.E.D. program for being recognized by Penn State Hershey Pro Wellness Center as a "Health Champion" program.
- The district has been tracking energy usage through the EPA's Energy Star program at some level since 2008. Committed tracking began in 2012-2013. Hopewell was the only building that could be energy star certified when tracking began. Today, every building with the exception of the IS meets Energy Star Standards and can be certified as an Energy Star Building. A rating of 75 is required for official recognition. While we have not taken steps to receive official recognition at this point, efforts are being share only to substantiate the CEI program.

Our Energy Star Ratings

- Liberty Bell's rating improved from 62 to 78
- Middle School's rating improved from 68 to 82
- High School's rating improved from 66 to 77
- · Hopewell's rating declined from 84 to **76** (open doors during outside activities seemed to be primary reason)
- Lower Milford's rating improved from 62 to 78

· Intermediate School's rating improved from 52 to **65** (We are still working on this one.

- On September 17, representatives from the Partnership for 21st Century Learning, Washington DC, conducted a site-visit at the high school to evaluate our school for exemplar program status.. The team talked with administrators, visited classes throughout the day, and met with a panel of teachers, parents, and community partners. The 21st Century Learning Exemplar Program highlights best practices in schools and districts across the country that are preparing students for college, career and citizenship by embedding critical 21st century competencies into the learning environment. There are currently 40 schools throughout the nation with this designation and only two others in Pennsylvania. (One charter school, and one private school) Criteria for selection includes:
 - 1. Evidence of commitment to college, career, and life readiness
 - 2. Educational support systems and sustainable design
 - 3. Engaged learning approaches
 - 4. Equitable student access to 21st century learning
 - 5. Evidence of student acquisition of 21st century knowledge and skills
 - 6. Partnerships for sustainable success

P21 and its partners use this rubric to guide the evaluation of schools for exemplar status during onsite visits. The rubric, which was developed in consultation with external advisers and evaluation design experts, provides a framework for considering the extent to which schools demonstrate successful implementation of key areas of the P21 Framework and the factors that may support that success. We will be notified in January or February of the results.
