Mr. McGinty gave the following report

Intermediate School students and staff deserve a big, collective pat on the back and congratulations for a successful opening of the new school. Our staff has done, and continues to do exemplary work for our students under new, demanding circumstances. Overall, our students are happy in their new environment and are acclimating to the flow of their new schedules and surroundings.

- As we approach the completion of our third six-day cycle students have made great strides adjusting to both the mixing of groups and the rotation of classes. Over the past three weeks, we have administered 4SIGHT, DIBELS, as well as other baseline assessments, held Open House and had school pictures taken.
- As of today our library is open. Special thanks go out to Heidi Schiavone and all of the parent volunteers that worked tirelessly to merge various collections of books and resources from different schools and grade levels.
- This week we will be conducting the AIMSweb math assessment. We will also be holding data meetings to review the results of DIBELS and recommend intervention groups for students. The same type of data meetings will be held for AIMSweb math assessment results next week.
- Our chorus, band and orchestra have started meeting and practicing. In chorus alone, there are 160 170 students participating this year. To provide time for large grade level group meetings, we have built into the Intermediate School schedule some "in-school" practice time for chorus, band and orchestra this seems to be working well so far.
- PowerSchool access information for our sixth grade parents and students was sent home today, and we are prepared to go live with student grades.
- The Intermediate School's outstanding front office staff, Deb Brader, and Susan Natiello, continue to amazingly do the work of 10 men and women. Their hard work and late hours continue to be a vital asset to our school. Additionally, our custodial and support staff lead by Mary Palmer are doing a fantastic job of assisting in the ironing-out of new building glitches.

Lehigh Career & Technical Institute

Mr. Miracle reported that due to state budgetary issues LCTI can not formulate their budget. Health care costs are a large portion of the percentage increase that LCTI is facing.

Education Committee

The meeting discussed the curriculum items from the board meeting agenda.

Facilities Committee

The committee met on September 16th. Items related to the completion of the Intermediate School building were discussed. A 7-day notice was given on our fields, there are some trees that will need to be replaced, the phones still have some unresolved issues, the HVAC system is still being balanced, the noise issue with the HVAC system has been resolved, and they are moving forward with the punch list.

Our baseball field will need to be fixed in the near future. Mr. Dimmig noted that the sign at the entrance of Liberty Bell is in need of painting. Mr. Eddinger noted that the old maintenance building at the High School is in need of repair.

Budget & Finance Committee

The committee met on September 21st. They met with financial advisors in preparation for the special board meeting held September 23rd. The 5-year budget forecast was discussed and areas of expenditure and savings were presented.

Superintendent's Report

Mr. Liberati reported on his meeting with Ms. Platt from LCCC on adult continuing education courses to be offered at the Intermediate School to the community. Courses for the spring semester will include Introduction to Computers, Conversational Spanish, Chinese Dim Sum Cooking, Budding Artists, and a Finance Course on investing.

The District explored being a vaccination site for the H1N1 vaccine, but after investigating discovered that the protocols are prohibitive to our being able to successfully accomplish this. Examples of the hurdles were issues with storage of the vaccine, necessary clearances, and the need for extra personnel to assist with processing of patients among others.

The requested list of post secondary choices for the 2009 graduates was distributed.

Mr. Liberati presented information on AP coursework for the district. The information included information from surrounding school districts. Mr. Hayes and Mrs. Auteri will email information that they have found to members of the board. The board will discuss the topic further at the first meeting in November.
