Honors English 9 2014-2015

Course Description:

Within this rigorous course, students will focus on the fundamentals of reading, writing, vocabulary and grammar. Students will be expected to read and analyze a variety of short stories, plays, novels, poetry, historical texts, and other readings. The curriculum will specifically include the Five-paragraph essay which will emphasize MLA format and the six Write Traits.

This course is designed for students planning on attending college upon graduation.

Course Content:

Writing: This unit will introduce

- 1. the Five-Paragraph Essay
- 2. MLA Format
- 3. Narrative, Informative, and Persuasive Writing

Vocabulary: All words will be derived from the context of the literature being studied

Grammar: This unit will consist of

- 1. Subject/Verb Agreement
- 2. Fused sentences and Comma Splices
- 3. Phrases and Clauses (Commas, Semi-colons, Colons)

Literature: Analysis of literary elements and terms in the folowing forms: Short Story, Novel, Nonfiction, Drama, and Poetry

SSR: Students will read and respond to a book fo choice for a period of assigned time on Day 5/Day 6 of each cycle.

Required Textbooks and/or Other Reading/Research Materials

- 1. Adventures in Reading: This will be your main textbook for the year. It contains short stories, novels, plays, and poetry, many of which we will be reading this year. The following are in your AIR book:

- 6. English by Houghton Mifflin: This will be the resource used during the grammar unit.

Course Requirements:

Each student is required to complete all classwork, homework, and assessments. All assignments must be made up within one week, or they will not be accepted.

Grade Components/Assessments:

All assignments will be graded as expressed in the Southern Lehigh High School Handbook. Grades will be designated for homework, classwork, and summative assessments. Formal essays will be graded according to the 6 Write Traits and MLA format.
