Course Description:

CERAMICS II is developed to provide interested students the opportunity to continue to work in clay beyond the level I class. In this course, students will develop their artistic ceramic skills at a higher level of craftsmanship. Students will have the opportunity to explore expressing their creativity and ideas with their newly developed skills. The team of both teacher and student will develop projects that will reflect the individual's interest. The expectation of this class is that the students take an ambitious, self-disciplined approach to growth and self-expression. This is a student driven course.

Course Content:

Students will be completing 4-5 projects and one paper throughout the semester.

Projects, Will be an extention of what they learned during Ceramics Iwhich may include but may not be limited to such as, Hand built sculpture, Hand built coil piece, Slab constructed piece, combinations of techniques, experimentation of both materials as well as glazing and possible wheel throwing (if time and space permit).
