- Counselor/Teacher Recommendation Letters
- Extracurricular Involvement
- Student's Demonstrated Interest
- Interview (if available)

# Research & Visit Colleges

- Schedule in the spring of junior year, summer, fall of senior year
- Complete an educational trip form in advance & upon return to school bring a note from your parent
- Be well-informed about the school BEFORE your visit
- During the visit, talk with students & faculty
- Items you may want to take with you:
  - Transcript
  - Standardized Test Scores
  - Resume

# College Admissions Rep. Visits

- Rep visits to SLHS occur primarily in Sept., Oct., & Nov.
- Students sign up to attend in Naviance
- Visits are scheduled during Spartan
   Period

Students should use a professional email address to:

- Communicate with college representatives
- 2. Register for standardized tests
- 3. Apply to colleges

# College Entrance Tests

- ACT
  - Offered April 4<sup>th</sup> (register by Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>)
  - Offered June 13<sup>th</sup> (register by May 8<sup>th</sup>)
  - Offered July 18, Sept. 12, & Oct. 24
  - www.actstudent.org
- SAT
  - Offered May 2<sup>nd</sup> (register by April 3<sup>rd</sup>)
  - Offered June 6<sup>th</sup> (register by May 8<sup>th</sup>)
  - Offered AUGUST 29, Oct. 3 & Nov. 7
  - www.collegeboard.org

### **ACT**

- English (45 min): standard written English & rhetorical skills
- Math (60 min)
- Reading (35 min): comprehension
- Science (35 min): interpretation, analysis, evaluation, reasoning, & problem-solving skills
- Optional Writing (40 min)

Scale 1-36 (Each section; includes Composite)

Cost is \$52 or \$68 WITH WRITING

4 free score reports; \$13 charge for each additional school

### SAT

- Evidence-Based Reading & Writing
  - 65 minute Reading section
  - 35 minute Language & Writing
- Math
  - 55 minutes WITH calculator
  - 25 minutes WITHOUT calculator
- Optional Essay
  - 50 minutes

Scale 1600 (800 Math & 800 ERW; separate writing score)

Cost is \$49.50 or \$64.50 WITH ESSAY

4 free score reports; \$12 charge for each additional school

# **SAT Subject Tests**

- Required by the most selective colleges & universities for admission
- English Literature, U.S. History, World History, Mathematics Levels I and II, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, & World Languages (French, Spanish, Chinese, Japanese)
- Each exam is one hour in length; can take up to three exams on one SAT test date
- See which tests may be required for certain majors
   Total Cost for 2 Subject Tests = \$70

## Common Application

- www.commonapp.org
- Almost 900 member colleges & universities
- Application can be submitted to any number of colleges you indicate
- Individual colleges may have additional requirements (i.e. writing supplements)
- Must complete FERPA agreement as well as enter your Common App username and password in Naviance in order for your transcript to be sent

# **Coalition Application**

www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org

 Allows for the individualization of application by uploading music, videos, artistic works, etc.

### **Admissions Decisions**

 <u>Early Action</u> – apply EARLY and receive an EARLY decision (non-binding)

 <u>Early Decision</u> – apply EARLY, receive EARLY decision, if accepted MUST attend and withdraw all other applications (BINDING)

 Rolling Admissions – as applications roll in, decisions roll out; APPLY EARLY!

## Letters of Recommendation

- Complete the Teacher Recommendation Questionnaire
- Allow a minimum of 3 weeks for teacher letters
- Ask your teachers personally first before requesting in Naviance
- Select 1 or 2 teachers that know you well
- Not all schools require letters of recommendation (ex. PA state universities)
- Waiving your right of access: It is best to waive your right of access because colleges and universities will feel as though they are getting a true evaluation of you. However, do what you are most comfortable with.

#### Counselor Letter of Recommendation

- Complete the Counselor Recommendation
   Questionnaire
- Complete the Parent Input Form
- Allow a minimum of 3 weeks for counselor letters
- Ask your counselor personally
- Not all schools require counselor letters

# JUNIOR YEAR – Spring

- Think about what you want to do utilize Personality
   Profile and Career Interest Profiler to explore careers
- Explore college search engines
- Develop list of prospective colleges
- Tour college campuses & talk with college reps, professors, and students
- Take the SAT and/or ACT make sure to list 4 colleges to receive score reports FREE when you register
- Take AP exams in May if enrolled in course(s)
- Plan a CHALLENGING & APPROPRIATE senior year schedule
- Look for summer jobs, internships, volunteer activities
- Request letters of recommendation (if required)

## SENIOR YEAR - Fall

- Take SAT/ACT again (if necessary)
- Secure letters of recommendation in Naviance
- Narrow down list of colleges to 5 10
- Organize your application materials noting requirements and admissions/financial aid deadlines
- Utilize national scholarship searches as well as Naviance to research local and national scholarship opportunities
- Attend SLHS Financial Aid Program in October
- APPLY EARLY!!!!!


