#### Course Selection Process

8th Grade Teachers have entered course recommendations based upon students' current performance in core content courses (including World Language)

Students must meet course prerequisite grades in order to enroll in honors level courses and math courses.

- Students will input their course selections into Sapphire <u>Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> through Feb. 6<sup>th</sup></u> at their convenience. ALL course selections must be entered during this window.

## Spartan Period

- 40 minutes in length
- INTERVENTION & ENRICHMENT
- Students will select activities (one per cycle day for a total of 6)
- Students may be selected by their teachers for intervention programs if they are in need of additional support

## Homeroom & Lunches

Attendance is taken in Block/Class #1

- Lunch will be included in Block/Class #3
  - Lunch 1: Before class
  - Lunch 2: In the middle of class
  - Lunch 3: At the end of class



- <u>1/2 Day Option</u>: Students spend 1/2 day at Southern Lehigh (English, Social Studies, Math, and Science) and the remainder of the day at LCTI
- 1st Year LCTI students rotate through 3 technical areas for approximately 7 days each before selecting desired lab
  - Approximately 35 labs to choose from
  - See Mrs. Cooper for an application; applications are due March 1<sup>st</sup>




Math Sequence for ALL students will be Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II.



- We encourage students to become involved in activities at the high school!





