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Family Letter

Dear Southern Lehigh Students and Families:

The Southern Lehigh School District (SLSD) continues to seek out and provide services to support families as they navigate the complexities of the COVID-19 pandemic. We know this has been a challenging school year for many families and some students have struggled academically. Throughout the school year, the following supports have been available:

- 4 day in-person instruction
- Friday office hours with teachers
- In-person support on Fridays
- Academic contracts
- Extended deadlines
- Tutoring sessions
- One-on-one and group counseling
- Student and parent meetings
- Collaboration with parents
- Saturday study hall (at Middle School)

Regrettably, some students continue to fail or have failed courses despite these and other supports that have been available. At the High School level, failing courses could potentially jeopardize graduation by the end of the senior year. At the Middle School level, failing a course may impact a student's ability to understand content taught in future courses. Additionally, as per Board Policy 215, "a student in middle school who fails two (2) or more major subjects shall be considered for retention. Summer school may be an option to make up a failed course. The building principal shall be assigned the final responsibility for determining the promotion or retention of each student." If your child is being considered for retention, additional communication will be forthcoming from the Middle School principal.

The Southern Lehigh School District will be offering three secondary summer school options:

Option 1: Southern Lehigh School District In-Person Summer School

Made possible by COVID-19 relief funds, Southern Lehigh School District is able to offer a limited selection of SLSD courses for summer school and credit recovery in Summer 2021. Taught in-person, at the Southern Lehigh High School, these courses will be condensed into 66 instructional hours for 1 credit courses and 33 hours for ½ credit courses. 66 instructional hours for middle school courses. This SLSD Summer School option includes both in-person learning and homework. Lunches will be available, as well as transportation (if needed). There is no cost to families.

Option 2: eLearn21 Virtual Summer Learning Academy with In-Person Support

Made possible by COVID-19 relief funds, Southern Lehigh School District is able to offer eLearn21 courses along with in-person support for summer school and credit recovery in Summer 2021. eLearn21 is the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit's Virtual Learning Program. Students choosing this option will complete self-paced, asynchronous, online courses. However, students choosing this option MUST also physically report to the High School for 2.5 hours a day for four weeks per course. During that time, a tutor will be available to support students and monitor course completion. Additional time outside of the classroom may be needed to complete an

entire eLearn21 course. Lunches will be available, as well as transportation (if needed). There is no cost to families.

Option 3: eLearn21 Virtual Summer Learning Academy

As in previous years, eLearn21 will continue to be offered for summer school and credit recovery in Summer 2021. eLearn21 is the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit's Virtual Learning Program. Students choosing this option will complete self-paced, asynchronous, online courses. The cost for enrollment in the course(s) may apply.

Attendance and Absences for In-Person Summer School Options

Reporting Absences

A written doctor's excuse stating the reason for a pupil's absence from summer school is required for each absence.

Assignments During Absence

When a student is absent from the Southern Lehigh School District In-Person Summer School, it is the student's responsibility to communicate with their teachers or tutor via telephone, email, or by checking assignments posted on the teacher website or Sapphire.

Unexcused Absences and Summer School Grades

Due to the compressed nature of summer school courses, it is expected that students attend all in-person summer school classes in the course in which they are enrolled. In the event that a student has unexcused absences within the Southern Lehigh School District In-Person Summer School option, the student may be withdrawn from the class. Vacations are unexcused and not permitted during summer school.

Tardiness to Class

Students are expected to be in summer school class upon the start time. Tardiness to class in the Southern Lehigh School District In-Person Summer School option may result in having to make up the work and/or instructional time.

Code of Conduct for In-Person Summer School Options

Southern Lehigh secondary schools can better ensure disruption-free learning environments by employing preventative and proactive approaches to student misbehavior.

As classroom managers, teachers will establish classroom rules and make decisions concerning appropriate discipline of students in class. Additionally, all secondary school staff members have responsibility to enforce school rules in common areas such as the halls, lavatories, cafeteria, etc. This includes during summer school.

The administration will work with teachers, parents, guardians and students to help students understand and comply with school rules. Parent and guardian support and cooperation is important in that it helps students to see adults as working partners in this process.

For the protection and safety of all students, please know that video and audio recording devices may be utilized on school buses. Behavior and communication of students, while riding school buses, may be used for purposes of student discipline under provisions of the District's Bus Transportation Policy, Student Discipline Code, and the Public School Code.

During in-person summer school, students are expected to follow the High School Code of Conduct outlined in the [High School Handbook](#). All applicable District policies must be followed. Not following the Code of Conduct may result in being withdrawn from in-person summer school and/or additional disciplinary action in accordance with the Code of Conduct, District Policy, and/or laws.

Option 1: Southern Lehigh School District In-Person Summer School

Description: Made possible by COVID-19 relief funds, Southern Lehigh School District is able to offer a limited selection of SLSD courses for summer school and credit recovery in Summer 2021. Taught in-person, at the Southern Lehigh High School, these courses will be condensed into 66 instructional hours for 1 credit courses and 33 hours for ½ credit courses. 66 instructional hours for middle school courses. This SLSD Summer School option includes both in-person learning and homework. Lunches will be available, as well as transportation (if needed). There is no cost to families.

Location: Southern Lehigh High School (In-Person)

Dates: Every day of the week, Monday through Friday

- 1 Credit and Middle School Courses: June 14, 2021 to July 9, 2021; with July 5, 2021 being an asynchronous learning day
- .5 Credit Courses: June 14, 2021 to June 25, 2021

Session Times (one session per course DAILY Monday-Friday):

- AM Session: 8:30 to 11:00
- PM Session: 12:00 to 2:30

Lunch:

- For students who are attending both AM and PM sessions, lunch will be provided between 11:00 and 12:00
- A grab and go lunch will be available for students who attend either an AM session or a PM session only. No eating in the classroom or bus will be allowed due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Cost: No cost to families

High School Grades, Credits, and Transcripts: Students who successfully complete a summer school course will receive a passing grade and earn the appropriate credit on their transcript. Passing will not impact the overall GPA. The original failing course grade(s) from 2020-2021 will still be calculated in the overall GPA on your child's high school transcript.

High School In-Person Summer School Class List - AM

Summer school classes are subject to cancellation based on low enrollment. The following classes are Southern Lehigh School District courses taught through compressing the content and curriculum of their respective course(s).

AM Sessions (8:30 am to 11:00 am)

SS ENGLISH 9: English 9 SS compresses the content and curriculum taught in English 9 for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in an English 9 course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 English credit towards graduation requirements. Students will focus on the fundamentals of reading and writing. Vocabulary and grammar will be taught within the context of both writing and literature. Students will study non-fiction, short stories, drama, poetry and/or novels.

SS ENGLISH 12: English 12 SS compresses content and curriculum taught in English 12 for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in an English 12 course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 English credit towards graduation requirements. Concentration will include communicating with coworkers and supervisors. Specific employment skills regarding securing, upgrading, and changing jobs will be addressed. Additionally, traditional academic expectations in the areas of oral, written, and research presentations will be required.

SS UNITED STATES HISTORY: 1850 TO THE PRESENT: United States History: 1850 to the Present SS compresses the content and curriculum taught in United States History: 1850 to the Present for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in a United States History course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 Social Studies credit towards graduation requirements. The course will explore US history and culture from the onset of the Civil War through the dawn of the 21st Century. Special emphasis is placed on practical aspects of the major political, cultural, economic, and social themes and events that have shaped our nation's development during this time period.

SS HEALTH: Health SS compresses the content and curriculum taught in Health 9 and Health 11-12 - Wellness for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in a High School Health course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover .5 Health credit towards graduation requirements. Health SS will address emerging health topics such as: healthy relationships, abstinence, consequences associated with risky behaviors, personal responsibility, mental and emotional health, physical health, drug awareness, and/or refusal skills. During the course, students will develop an individualized action plan that promotes lifelong wellness.

SS 9-12 GENERAL SCIENCE: 9-12 General Science SS compresses the general science content and curriculum in Biology, Physics, and Chemistry courses. It is available to students who did not pass a High School science course in the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 Science credit towards graduation requirements. Topics will include, but are not limited to: Scientific Method, Scientific Tools, Metric System, Characteristics of Living Things, Chemistry of Living Things, and Cell Structure and Function. Properties of Matter and the changes it undergoes will be addressed including an introduction to the laws that govern motion.

High School In-Person Summer School Class List - PM

Summer school classes are subject to cancellation based on low enrollment. The following classes are Southern Lehigh School District courses taught through compressing the content and curriculum of their respective course(s).

PM Sessions (12:00 pm to 2:30 pm)

ENGLISH 11 SS: English 11 SS compresses the content and curriculum from English 11 for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in an English 11 course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 English credit towards graduation requirements. The course will focus on communication skills that will be required in the workplace. Students will utilize materials designed to develop the oral, written, visual, and non-verbal communication skills necessary for future success.

CIVICS AND GOVERNMENT SS: Civics and Government SS compresses content and curriculum from Civics and Government for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in a Civics and Government course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 Social Studies credit towards graduation requirements. The course will explore the foundation of both the US federal government as well as the state government of Pennsylvania. Students will study the various branches of government. Special emphasis will be placed on the rights and responsibilities that citizens in the United States possess and the many ways they can play a role in government at the federal, state, and local levels.

WORLD CULTURES SS: World Cultures SS compresses the content and curriculum from World Cultures for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in a World Cultures course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover 1 Social Studies credit towards graduation requirements. The course will explore events and themes that have shaped the cultures of Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America from 1500 to the present.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION SS: Physical Education SS compresses the content and curriculum taught in Individual & Team Sports, as well as Personal Fitness for the purpose of credit recovery. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in a Physical Education course during the 2020-2021 school year. Students will receive a Pass/Fail grade that will not impact their overall GPA on their transcript, but upon passing will recover .5 Physical Education credit towards graduation requirements. The course will offer both competitive sports (individual and team) and activities to improve/maintain physical fitness.

AM Sessions (8:30 am to 11:00 am)

GRADE 8 LANGUAGE ARTS SS: Grade 8 Language Arts SS compresses the content and curriculum from Grade 8 Language Arts. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in Grade 8 Language Arts and/or Literacy Courses during the 2020-2021 school year. It will address writing, text comprehension and communication skills.

GRADE 7 LANGUAGE ARTS SS: Grade 7 Language Arts SS compresses the content and curriculum from Grade 7 Language Arts. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in Grade 7 Language Arts and/or Literacy Courses during the 2020-2021 school year. It will address writing, text comprehension and communication skills.

GRADE 8 MATHEMATICS SS: Grade 8 Mathematics SS compresses the content and curriculum from Grade 8 Mathematics. It is available to students who did not earn a passing grade in Grade 8 Mathematics during the 2020-2021 school year. It focuses on five mathematical domains: (1) The Number system, (2) Expressions and Equations, (3) Functions, (4) Geometry, and (5) Statistics and Probability.

Description: Made possible by COVID-19 relief funds, Southern Lehigh School District is able to offer eLearn21 courses along with in-person support for summer school and credit recovery in Summer 2021. eLearn21 is the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit's Virtual Learning Program.
