How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

→ The Health and Safety Plan will be monitored and updated as required based on guidance from the CDC, Pennsylvania Department of Health, other organizations such as the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and local conditions.

How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

- → Education will be provided in-person utilizing traditional schedules and district calendars.
- → The following options are available under defined periods of need:
 - On-line option (Spartan Academy)
 - Combination of in-person and cyber instruction for students excluded from school under <u>policy</u> <u>#203.</u> This option is subject to ongoing review.
 - Homebound instruction for students with time-limited medical excuses (this option has long been available to students)
- → The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to operate a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) for students throughout the 2021-2022 School Year. Through the continued use of the MTSS system, the SLSD will complete interventions in English/Language Arts and Mathematics.
- → The Southern Lehigh School District will provide the following behavioral health supports and social emotional learning opportunities for students and staff during the 2021-2022 school year;
 - <u>Students</u> Students in the SLSD will continue to have access to the following behavioral health supports and social emotional learning opportunities;
 - Access to School Counselors in each School Building

 - K-12 Student Assistance Program
 - K-12 Child Study Team

 - Mental Health Resources and Behavioral Health Supports
 - <u>Staff</u> Employees of the Southern Lehigh School District continue to have access to the following Behavioral Health Supports through the Southern Lehigh School District;
 - <u>SLSD Employee Assistance Program: Preferred EAP</u>
 - SLSD Employee Benefit Plan Behavioral Health Supports; Highmark
 - Regional Crisis Intervention Resources

- → The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to offer free lunch to the students in the SLSD community via the Federal feeding programs in place as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Depending on the time of the school year, free lunch programing will be offered in the following formats;

 - Grab-And-Go Curbside Pick Up

Universal and correct wearing of masks;	Masking requirements while on school district property will be revised based on a variety of factors including local conditions. These factors may include clusters of illness and updated mandates. Masking for district students and staff is optional beginning on January 24, 2022.
	Facemasks may be worn by individual choice only, by anyone on the grounds or within the authority of the Southern Lehigh School District. No personnel or representative of the Southern Lehigh School District may, at any time, for any reason, force, coerce, request, discourage or encourage anyone to wear a facemask against that person's expressed or implied will. Nor may any personnel or representative of the Southern Lehigh School District impose any extra requirement or disallow anyone from participation in any district-related activity for choosing to wear or not wear a facemask.
Modifying facilities to allow for <u>physical</u> <u>distancing</u> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	Classrooms and other instructional spaces will be configured to promote learning. Physical distancing will be maximized as feasible.
<u>Transportation</u>	Under the <u>Federal Order</u> issued in January 2021, the CDC requires the use of masks, regardless of vaccination status, when on public transportation which includes school buses operated by public or private school systems. A bus driver, if he/she is the only person on the bus, does not need to wear a mask.
Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	 The SLSD will encourage frequent hand washing with students and employees in all school district buildings. <u>CDC Handwashing In Community Settings</u> <u>CDC Handwashing Poster</u> <u>CDC Stop the Spread of COVID-19 Poster</u>
	 The SLSD will continue to provide hand sanitizer in all District classrooms and strategically placed in high traffic areas throughout school buildings <u>CDC Hand Sanitizer Use</u> <u>FDA Hand Sanitizer Guidelines</u>

	The SLSD will continue ongoing communication with District stakeholders regarding ways that students, families, and staff can practice <u>safe hygiene at home</u> .
<u>Cleaning</u> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <u>ventilation;</u>	Cleaning, Disinfection, and Sanitization The Southern Lehigh School District Support Services Staff will clean, disinfect, and/or sanitize each classroom, restroom, hallway, and touch points per existing <u>CDC</u> <u>Recommendations on Cleaning Public Facilities.</u>
	 Ventilation All Southern Lehigh school buildings have been designed to meet ASHRAE standards for continuous air filtration and the introduction of filtered outside air. School building ventilation and filtration should continuously operate during occupied times. MERV 13 filters will be used during the pandemic. Filtration of no less than MERV 8 will be used if MERV 13 filters are not compatible. Outdoor air circulation should exchange indoor air multiple times per day. At no time should it fall below ASHRAE levels for occupied buildings.
<u>Contact tracing</u> in combination with <u>isolation</u> and modified quarantine in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	Southern Lehigh School District will utilize its <u>Immunization and Communicable Disease Policy (203)</u> for infectious disease strategies. The district will not perform contract tracing or quarantine students who are not infected unless mandated to do so by governing authorities.
	Students and staff are encouraged to report positive cases to the school nurse or other district staff.
	The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to update the digital reference tool that will denote positive cases on the <u>SLSD COVID-19 Resources Website</u> .
Diagnostic and screening testing;	The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to educate Southern Lehigh School District families on the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 while encouraging families that they should refrain from sending their student(s) to school if he/she is displaying symptoms related to COVID-19.

	The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to educate Southern Lehigh School District staff on the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 while encouraging staff that they should stay home if they are displaying symptoms related to COVID-19. Parents are required to report a positive diagnosis of a student case of COVID-19 to the appropriate SLSD School Nurse.Employees are required to report a positive diagnosis of COVID-19 to the Director of Human Resources.
Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school</u> <u>communities;</u>	The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to collaborate with regional healthcare partners and or other regional providers to advertise additional COVID-19 vaccination opportunities available in the school community.
Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	Southern Lehigh School District students with disabilities will receive accommodations as written in their IEP or 504 plans.
Coordination with state and local health officials.	The Southern Lehigh School District will continue to complete regular communication and collaboration with state, local, and community health partners.
Volunteers and Visitors to the Southern Lehigh School District	Volunteers or visitors to the Southern Lehigh School District for activities occurring either indoors or outdoors must follow the established Health and Safety Plan procedures.
Community Facility Use	The Southern Lehigh School District will permit the school district facilities use per Policy 707 Use of School Facilities.
