Southern Lehigh School District Cyber Charter Snapshot and District Response

What Are Charter Schools?

- → Charter Schools are public schools that are authorized to operate in the Commonwealth independently from traditional Public School Districts.
- → Act 22, the Commonwealth's Charter Law was adopted in 1997
 - Act 22 was amended in 2002 to include Cyber Charter Schools
 - Stated Purpose
 - Improve student learning
 - Increase educational opportunities for students
 - Encourage the use of different/innovative teaching methods
 - Create new professional opportunities for teachers; <u>and</u>
 - Provide expanded choices within the public school system

What Are Charter Schools?

→ There are **TWO TYPES** of Charter Schools in the Commonwealth;

Charter School Type	Authorization	Method of Instruction		
Brick-and-Mortar	Authorized to operate under a charter between a local Board of School Directors and the Charter School.	Instruction is delivered through face-to-face interaction at the schools' physical facilities.		
Cyber	Authorized to operate under a charter between the PA Department of Education and the Cyber Charter School.	Instruction is delivered via technology throug the internet or other electronic means.		


Currently, there 165 Brick-and-Mortar Charter Schools and 15 Cyber Charter schools operating across the Commonwealth.

What Are Charter Schools?


- Charter Schools are <u>EXEMPT</u> from many mandates that Public School Districts are <u>REQUIRED</u> to follow. Examples include;
 - Only 75% of professional employees must hold a state teaching certificate
 - Not required to provide gifted education to identified students
 - Not governed by publicly elected school boards
 - No requirement for teacher or administrative evaluations
 - No requirement to make a preliminary budget available to the public
 - No requirement for an independent, annual, year-end audit
- Charter students are also entitled to participate in <u>ANY</u> extracurricular or athletic activities <u>at their home school district</u> if an equivalent extracurricular or athletic activity is not offered by the Charter School.

Cyber Charter Performance in Pennsylvania

- When comparing the academic program at the Commonwealth's Cyber Charter Schools to traditional school districts the differences fundamental.
 - All 15 Cyber Charters in PA have been identified as needing some form of corrective action or enhanced state oversight under the US Department of Education ESSA Provisions. All 15 are classified one of the following;
 - Schools identified as Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) are those schools facing the <u>MOST</u> significant challenges in academic achievement, student growth, and other areas.
 - Schools identified as Targeted Support and Improvement (A-TSI) are schools where performance by one or more student groups is <u>AT OR</u> <u>BELOW</u> the level of the CSI schools.
 - No SLSD schools are identified in **ANY** of these classifications.















SLSD Charter School Tuition Snapshot


- Tuition payments to charter schools are based on the home district where the student resides, not the type of charter school the student attends.
- → Tuition payments are the **SAME** for Brick-and-Mortar CS's and Cyber CS's.
- → For the 2020/2021 School Year, the SLSD Charter Tuition Rates are;




SLSD Cyber Charter Impact Year Over Year

Cyber Charter School Recap

- → Cyber Charter Schools in the Commonwealth are;
 - Privately owned but publicly funded via tuition payments from students home school district and allocations of federal education funding.
 - Generally not held to the same mandates that govern the Commonwealth's public school districts.
 - Consistently demonstrate significantly lower State Assessment scores when compared to the SLSD.
 - Consistently demonstrate significantly lower Graduation Rates when compared to the SLSD.
- → With no action, the SLSD operating budget will eventually be at a tipping point where future budget decisions will be altered in order to address rising Cyber Chart expenditures.

SLSD Remote Learning

- The pandemic has led to a significant statewide increase in enrollments in a wide variety of Remote Learning Platforms.
- → When compared to the 2019 SY, 22,626 additional students across the Commonwealth were enrolled in Remote Learning Platforms than the PY.
- → That represents a statewide increase of 59%
- → As of the start of the 4th Marking Period, the Southern Lehigh School District has 817 students enrolled in Remote Learning Models;
 - ♦ 771 students (K-12) enrolled in the SLSD Remote Learning Model
 - ♦ 46 students (K-12) enrolled in the eLearn21 Remote Learning Model
- → This represents 26% of the District's total student population.

SLSD Contracted Remote Learning

Current SLSD Contracted Remote Learning Platform - eLearn21

- 19/20 Enrollment vs. 20/21 Enrollment
 - 19-20 SY SLSD averaged 20 full time students/month
 - 20-21 SY SLSD averaged 46 full time students/month
- → Of those 46 students, 33 are new to the program for the 20/21 School Year
- → Students from all School Buildings
- → Attendance/work completion is monitored by SLSD staff
- → The SLSD pays approximately \$5,500 per student to attend the SLSD Contracted Remote Learning Model (eLearn21).
- → The total cost to SLSD for eLearn21 is \$253,000 (CY) vs. \$110,000 (PY)

SLSD Changes for the 2021/2022 School Year

- Enhance SLSD Web Resources to include additional information about SLSD In-Person and a Contracted Remote Learning Program alongside the academic and financial data associated with Cyber Charter Schools.
- → Institute a procedures that requires yearly residency verification for SLSD students enrolled in Charter Schools.
- Offer Exit Interviews to students opting to enroll in Cyber Charter Schools to ensure that they understand the SLSD Contracted Remote Learning Program.
- Targeted District Communications focusing on;
 - SLSD Contracted Remote Learning Program
 - The actual costs associated with Cyber Charter Schools

Conclusion

- → In addition to the return of 5 Day, In-Person Instruction for the 2021/2022 School Year, the SLSD will need to continue offer a Contracted Remote Learning Program
 - EVALUATE and ADAPT the Contracted Remote Learning Program
 - RETAIN and RECRUIT SLSD students back to SLSD Programs;
- → SLSD continues to offers more resources to support all students than Cyber Charter Programs
 - Comprehensive Student Services including
 - Special Education, ESL, Gifted Education, School Counseling, SAP, Mental Health Programing, Career and Technical Education
 - Extracurricular & Athletic Activities
 - School Community
