Dear Southern Lehigh Families,

The District will soon begin administering the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) and Keystone Exams. These assessments are an essential part of our students' educational journey and help us evaluate both individual student growth and overall school performance.

Purpose of PSSA and Keystone Exams

The **PSSA** is administered to students in grades 3-8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics, as well as in grades 5 and 8 for Science. These assessments are designed to measure students' progress in meeting Pennsylvania's academic standards. This year, SLSD students in grades 4-8 will take the PSSA tests online. In 2026 and beyond, students in grades 3-12 will test online.

The **Keystone Exams** serve as end-of-course assessments in Algebra I, Literature, and Biology. They are taken by students in middle or high school upon completion of the corresponding coursework. The Keystone Exams help determine proficiency in these subject areas and serve as a graduation requirement in Pennsylvania. This year and beyond, students will take the Keystone tests online.

How Families Can Help

- Make sure your child's device (if using a district-issued laptop at home) is fully charged prior to each testing day (grades 4 through 12).
- Encourage your child to eat a good breakfast on the morning of exams.
- State requirements demand the District complete make-up testing for all students who are absent for any part of the PSSA and Keystone assessments. Please encourage your child to be well-rested, have a positive attitude, and do their best on all exams.

Additional Information

Please understand that under Chapter 4 of Title 22 of the Pennsylvania State Code, parents/guardians may request to review the testing materials and, if the assessment is found to be in conflict with religious beliefs, must provide a written request to the Superintendent for a religious opt-out. Parents requesting to review materials for a potential religious opt-out must then schedule a meeting with the building principal to review materials and sign a Parent Confidentiality Agreement. Religious conflict is the only basis under Chapter 4 rules for a parent/guardian to excuse a child from statewide assessments.
