SLSD Parents/Guardians and Staff,

We hope that this message finds the families of the Southern Lehigh School District community well. Week three of the 2021-2022 school year has come to a close and the hallways of our five school buildings are filled with the robust sights and sounds of learning. We are so happy that those sights and sounds are totally different from the silence we heard in the halls last year at this time. We remain thankful for the hard work that our students and staff are engaged in as they progress somewhat normally through this school year. Outlined below are some updates and reminders for the entire Southern Lehigh School District community;

- National Merit Scholarship Competition Congratulations to Southern Lehigh High School Senior, Alexander Ding on being named a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist. Alexander joins approximately 16,000 of the highest scoring students across the United States who are now competing for approximately 7,500 scholarships worth nearly \$30 million. The 16,000 National Merit Semifinalists represent less than 1 percent of top performing high school seniors in the United States. Additional congratulations to the following SLHS Seniors, Sofia Boensch, Mohammad Durrani, Alex Lyon, and Christian Piper who were named National Merit Commended students. The National Merit Commended designation is given to approximately 34,000 of the highest scoring students in the nation. Although National Merit Commended Students do not qualify for the National Merit Scholarships they represent high levels of academic achievement. Thank you to all of these students for their hard work and dedication and thank you to our staff for the role that they have played in the development of these students throughout their academic careers.
- AP Scholar Awards Each fall, the Advanced Placement Program recognizes high school students that have demonstrated outstanding college level achievement through their performance on multiple Advanced Placement Exams. Congratulations to the 61 current Southern Lehigh High School Students and 2021 graduates that have been named Advanced Placement Scholars by the College Board for demonstrating college-level achievement on the AP examinations in May of 2021. The College Board recognizes three levels of achievements based on the number of courses and exams.

We continue to ask that all families complete daily <u>COVID-19 symptom</u> screening before school each morning. This critical step helps to ensure that all of our students and staff are able to remain in school. If your children are exhibiting any symptoms or are ill for any reason, please keep them home, even if the symptoms seem to be mild. No child should return to school until he or she is well and symptom free for 24 hours without medication, completes a consultation with a primary care physician, and/or receives a negative COVID-19 test.
