# "Shake-Out"

On October 21 at 10:21 AM the Middle School in cooperation with Lehigh County Emergency Management participated in an earthquake drill called "Shake-Out" The students were instructed in the appropriate actions to take during an earthquake or severe weather in which physical dangers are often presented by falling debris. The students had demonstrated for them acceptable "Shakeout" drill techniques, through the use of student and staff made videos.



### **Critical Incident Drill:**

The students of the Middle School participated in a Critical Incident Drill on September 21. The Critical Incident Drill is a component part of the overall A.L.I.C.E. model (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Confront, Evacuate) adopted by the Southern Lehigh School District. The focus of the Critical Incident drill is for students to become accustomed to reaching logical, rational, decisions about their safety and that of others using on-the-spot information. It is the hope of the model developer that these techniques will prove useful throughout life.

### Parade:

The Southern Lehigh Middle School Band put its best foot forward, musically and literally, in the Coopersburg Halloween Parade on Sunday, October 17. It is an annual tradition for the SLMS Band to participate in the parade, which was canceled last year due to the pandemic. Preparations for the parade began the first week of school, when Mr. Loda selected a parade tune that best matches the mix of instruments and abilities of this year's Band, and this time around the Bruno Mars hit song, *Grenade was* selected. The 63 Band musicians at SLMS meet for small group lessons every third school day for 46 minutes, and also have one weekly, full rehearsal every Thursday for 37 minutes.

The first 3 weeks were devoted to learning the music; they also had to learn ~10 additional tunes for our annual Band in the Stands collaboration with the High School Band, and our percussion students also learned a drum cadence, which is a short piece that only features the percussion section. Once the parade tune and drum cadence were learned, they started to head outside to take their first steps together. Since we are only a 7th and 8th grade building, nobody in the Middle School Band had ever marched while playing. Taking that into consideration, the students did their first few marching lessons in their lesson groups in the rear parking lot, and eventually the track. These lessons focused on learning basic marching commands and technique, staying in formation as they moved while playing, and perhaps most importantly, building up their endurance.

The full Band then had just 4 rehearsals to assemble its parade block and practice on the track. The students did a phenomenal job finding their "land legs" while moving and playing as one unit in their short time together. The SLMS band led the 3rd section on the day of the parade, and Mr. Loda was filled with

pride as the SLMS Band represented our school and its instrumental music program once again to our community. It is great to be back!


# **SLMS Greenpower Activity**
