#### COURSE SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. Review **Program of Studies** for course offerings and information.
  - a. Course Descriptions Pg 20-69
  - b. Grade 10 Course Selection Worksheet Pg 80
  - c. Course Elective Worksheet Pg 78
- 2. Talk to your teachers, see what course they recommended 1/21-2/1
- 3. Courses are selected by teachers based on current grades.
- 4. Input elective courses 2/2-2/14 based on interests and future goals.
- 5. Counselors will be available in the cafeteria during the lunches **2/3-2/14** for questions and will be visiting social studies classrooms to review course requests.
