- 2. Talk to your teachers, see what course they recommended 2/10-2/18
- 3. Courses are selected by teachers based on current grades.
- 4. Input elective courses 2/20 -2/28 based on interests and future goals.
- 5. Email counselor if you would like to discuss or attend Counselor Office Hours for scheduling questions 2/12 & 2/19 (11:00 AM 12:00 PM).
