I. Call to Order: Allison called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.

III. Report of Officers:

- A. President's Report (Jennifer Philipp)

- B. Vice President's Report (Allison Cawley)

 - 2. Allison talked about many parents still not having clearances to volunteer for school events (there were many parents that wanted to volunteer for the Halloween party but they did not have the proper clearances). Ms. Limpar has sent several notices home already with regards to obtaining proper clearances. She said she could put it on Blackboard connect and post it during parent teacher conferences as well. Ms. Limpar reviewed the times clearances are needed.
 - 3. A huge thank you to Tiffany Gyuricsko and Melissa Moffatt for running the fall social. It was fantastic. Compliments to DJ Drake. Suggestions for next year: maybe a coffee bar for the parents.
 - 4. December 5th is the breakfast with Santa and the Holiday shop. Carla Stock is chairing this event. Diana's Cafe will be catering the breakfast. Hopewell does not make any money from the breakfast. Complimentary pictures with Santa for those who purchase breakfast. All others are \$3 for a picture with Santa. Children 3 and under are free for the breakfast buffet. Children ages 3 to 5 pay \$5.00 and ages 6 and up pay \$8.00.

D. Dawn Resch: Report on Meeting with the Superintendent. There were a couple of representatives from each school and Dr. Christman addressed the following:

- 1. New Building: The name will not change. The new building will be called Hopewell. Everything is right on schedule. They hope to be under roof by December 15th so they can begin work inside.
- 2. Road construction on Preston Lane: The Township's plan is to widen the road in the summer of 2017 to eliminate some of the congestion. The plan involves putting a circle in between the middle school and the high school to keep the traffic flowing.
- 3. Raffles are not allowed (also called Games of Chance). You can have a raffle if you apply online. It costs \$25 for a permit. Allow five weeks for processing.
- 4. Keystone Test: Currently, all high school students need to pass the Keystone test in order to graduate. If the students do not pass the test, they are required to complete projects for all subjects. This takes away teaching time. You may get in contact with your legislators to express concerns regarding these tests.
- 5. Emergency Preparedness: Each building has audits and drills to practice. Drills include blocking exits and finding alternate routes. Ms. Limpar stated that it is required by law that 2 safety drills are done per month. One is always a fire drill, the other may be a weather related drill or intruder drill. In the event students need to leave school grounds, the social hall on Lanark road is the designated meeting place for a true evacuation. We have a whole emergency preparedness plan and are required to practice these plans.
- 6. Weapons policy: Students cannot bring any weapons or look-a-like weapons on school grounds. Students can be expelled for one year. This is a state law. This needs to be communicated to parents. This law is for the safety of all students.
- 7. Social Media: We have the Southern Lehigh Website. They are also on Twitter (Hashtag SLSD crowd). There is also a Facebook page for Southern Lehigh. There is also a mobile app.
- 8. Hopewell PTA is allowed to have a Facebook page but we need to be strict as to what information goes on there.
- E. Phantoms Game is scheduled for Friday, January 8th. Sonny Lemmons is organizing this event. There have been 49 tickets sold to date. There are 100 tickets allotted to each of the 3 elementary schools.
