A message from the Principal...

Dear Hopewell families:

Thank you for a great first month of school. It's hard to believe October is already here. We're looking forward to a number of upcoming October events. I hope you'll find the following information useful:

In the beginning of each month, we'll send home a monthly PTA newsletter. Please take time to read the Hopewell Happenings as we'll attempt to share our previous month's highlights and identify upcoming events.

Please check out the Southern Lehigh School District website at **slsd.org**. Our website is another source for up-to-date school district and school information. On the related links you'll find parent and student resources, the elementary curriculum, library information, PTA updates, the school lunch menu, the parent / student handbook, and transportation information (including green slips). You may also "like" the Southern Lehigh School District and Hopewell PTA on Facebook.

Each month our food services department sends home a monthly lunch menu. On the opposite side of each school menu is a monthly Hopewell calendar of events that identifies school-wide or grade level events.

Please check your child's book bag daily for information that comes home from your child's teacher or the Hopewell office. If we are asking for papers to be signed and returned, we ask you to please send them back the next school day.

Who to call? Your child's teacher should always be your first contact when calling the school. They work directly with your child every day and are your best point of contact. When necessary, they may refer you to our reading specialist, Mrs. Kuntz man; our RTII teacher and math specialist, Mrs. Hufgard; the school psychologist, Dr. Lehtinen or me. To address your questions or concerns in a timely manner, we ask that you follow this protocol. We follow a team approach at Hopewell School and those who need to be involved and informed will receive communication from your child's teacher. If you have any questions, our school secretaries, Mrs. Privitera, Mrs. Sheats and Mrs. Schneck can also assist you. If you have a question about special classes, you should also contact our music, art, physed, librarian or tech smarts teacher directly. We can all be reached by email through our lastnamefirstinitial@slsd.org.

October is **National Bullying Prevention Month**. We'll be sharing short lessons and activities on bullying prevention in each class throughout the month. In addition, there will be an announcement each week made by a student that focuses on bullying and being kind to others. Please encourage your child to wear blue on **Monday, October 3** for Bullying Prevention Awareness Month.

Hopewell School Picture Day is scheduled with Christmas City Studio on **Tues.**, **October 4**th. Order forms have already been sent home with your child. Order forms must be completed and <u>paid for in advance</u>. Please call the office if you need another order form.

Our next PTA meeting is Wednesday, October 5th at 9:30 AM in the school cafeteria. We hope you plan to attend. Please bring another Hopewell parent with you!

Kindergarten Teachers will be holding a parent information session for parents only on Thursday, October 6 from 4:15 - 4:45. We hope you can join us!

Our **Halloween Parade** is scheduled for Friday, October 30th @ 2:00 PM. Please note that costumes may not include any type of weapon. Even look-alike weapons are prohibited on school property. This is a fun Hopewell tradition therefore your cooperation is appreciated. If rain or wet pavements force us to cancel the parade, a notice will be posted by noon on the Hopewell website. Let's hope for good weather since the parade cannot be rescheduled. Please note that student classroom celebrations are for our students only and classroom volunteers that have been prearranged by the classroom teacher. All classroom volunteers must be on the district's approved Volunteer List.

School Volunteers:

Please note a few times during our school year, classroom celebrations are planned for our students. A designated number of homeroom and PTA volunteers are established in advance. Volunteers are scheduled on a rotational, asneeded basis to assist for these activities or on field trips. AM Parent drop-off: In an attempt to keep bus traffic and car traffic separate, the drop off time for students arriving by CAR is between 8:40 AM and 8:50 AM. Car traffic should not pull into the bus lanes. Your cooperation is needed to help avoid traffic congestion on Hopewell Road. Staff are on duty during student arrival to direct traffic and assist. Please pull forward in the circle so several cars may unload at a time. Parents are asked to remain in their cars and have students ready to unload so this process moves safely and timely.

PM Parent drop off: PM kindergarten starts at 12:54 PM. Parent drop off is 12:45 – 12:50 in the parent drop off circle outside out front door.

Attendance: **Absence excuses** must be submitted within three school days of each absence or the absence will be considered unexcused. Please be aware that under a recent update to the PA School Code **all students are limited to 10 days of cumulative absences per school year**.

After 10 days of cumulative absence, a physician's excuse will be required for each subsequent absence. *Parents will receive written notification any time a child reaches 10 days of cumulative absences.*

Tardy to school: All students arriving after the 9 AM start time (or 12:54 PM for afternoon kindergarten) must have a parent or guardian escort them into the building and sign them into school. Please address time management issues at home so your child arrives on time – when your child arrives late it puts them into a "catch up mode" with their classmates and this can create unnecessary stress for your child.

Birthday invitations may not be distributed in school unless your child is inviting <u>all</u> members of the class. <u>We no longer celebrate birthdays with any form of edible treats due to serious food allergies that exist in many of our <u>students.</u></u>

Student foot attire: Footwear such as Heely's or other rolling shoes are not permitted in school. Shoes that tie, buckle, snap or fit securely around the foot are preferred for school day activities. Sneakers are needed on the days your child has physical education class.

Casual for a Cause: Each Friday, Hopewell staff dress Casual for a Cause. Some of the important foundations we've supported throughout the years are American Cancer Society, CHOP, United Way, Retinal research, camp scholarships, assisting local families in need, Veterans, Autism Awareness, Down's Syndrome, Kidney Foundation, Costumes for a Cause, Jump Rope for a Heart. Last year we also started to support local causes for local impact: Betty Lou's Pantry, JP Liberati memorial scholarship, COBcares community outreach, iTN senior transportation of LV. If you have ideas or causes you'd like us to support you are welcome to bring it to our attention. We have a very giving staff!

October is Bus Safety Awareness Month!

Please review Hopewell School's Bus Responsibilities and Dismissal Procedures

Each day at 3:30PM, we dismiss our students to our school buses by their grade level. We start with Kindergarten who sits in the front, then dismiss Third Grade, then Second Grade, and finish with First Grade.

Students are expected to board the school bus with kindergarten filling in the front seats, students in grades 1 and 2 sitting somewhere near the middle, and grade 3 sitting somewhere near the back of the bus.

There's an assigned school staff member who reports to each school bus <u>every day</u> at dismissal and serves as our part of our Dismissal Team.

Each day, before the bus pulls away, our Dismissal Team reviews the following bus safety expectations with all students on each bus:

- 1) Students are expected to report to their assigned seating area and remain in that same seat until the bus arrives at their designated stop. Students may never get off at another bus stop without a green slip completed by the parent.
- 2) Students are expected to sit safely on their bottoms and face forward at all times.
- 3) Students are responsible for keeping their hands, feet and objects to themselves and not touch or take other's belongings. Students may not to reach into the seat in front of them or behind them for any reason.
- 4) Students may not do homework on the bus. All pens, pencils and markers must be kept in book bags for student safety and to not encourage writing on bus seats.
- 5) Students may speak quietly to the person they share a seat with using words that make others feel comfortable, not uncomfortable. No teasing, name calling or making fun of anyone is allowed. We need to explain this to children as they often report back they were "just kidding."
- 6) No eating, drinking or chewing gum is permitted on any bus. Some of our students have severe allergic reactions to certain foods. Please explain this to your children.
- 7) No student has the right to tell another student where they can or cannot sit. Assigning seats is the responsibility of the bus driver, teachers, dismissal team or principal.
- 8) Students are expected to follow the bus driver's directions at all times. When a student violates the bus driver's rules and expectations, the bus driver will complete a bus referral form to the office and the parent will be notified. The child may receive an assigned seat as a consequence for misbehavior until the bus driver sees a change in student behavior. They may even lose their bus riding privilege for a period of time.
- 9) Students are encouraged to <u>worry about their own words and actions</u> and make sure they are "Being Nice, and Being Safe" at all times. When boys and girls try to be helpful and involve themselves in situations that are not their concern, it tends to escalate rather than de-escalate the situation.
- 10) Students are encouraged to use problem solving language to resolve issues that involve them on the bus: "Stop it, I don't like it, Leave me alone, I'm not going to let you bother me, If you keep doing that I'm going to tell the bus driver." If their words do not solve the problem, the child should report their concern <u>immediately</u> to the bus driver so their seat can be moved.

- 11) Students should be discouraged from sitting three to a seat unless absolutely necessary. Some students with behavior, sensory, attention and impulsivity issues should NEVER sit three to a seat. The bus driver and dismissal team staff will scan the bus and separate students who may not be able to sit together safely.
- 12) Pouncer Pals are Respectful, Responsible and Ready!

We'd appreciate if you'd have a regular discussion with your child about the importance of safe bus behavior and discuss the above student responsibilities with your child!
