 U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan recently recognized 335 schools as National Blue Ribbon Schools for 2015 based on their overall academic excellence or their progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups. Lower Milford was one of those schools and was awarded in the category of Exemplary High Performing Schools. In 2014, 47 Lower Milford students took the PSSA exam and 100% scored proficient or advanced in Math with 93.4% scoring proficient or advanced in English Language Arts. 


Last week was National Fire Prevention Week.

The feedback from host families was very positive as cultures were shared, gifts exchanged, and fond memories made. Language was no barrier as most utilized electronic translation or simple sign/body language. There were exchanges involving campfires with s'mores; traditional Chinese tea ceremonies; music, the Russian language, sharing on Chinese Muslims and much laughter. Overall a very nice experience for our school and community.

- Teachers and Instructional Assistants had two very productive in-service days on Friday, Oct. 9 and today. They spent both days revising and writing curriculum, pacing guides, and /or common assessments or in specific training with new resources or related to their content are in regional meetings. Teachers across grade levels met at the Intermediate School for their work and many expressed appreciation for having this valuable time to collaborate with colleagues within their department or grade level and across grade levels to ensure a logical progression on knowledge and skills for our students. - Mrs. Siegfried and I visited Johns Hopkins School of Education in Baltimore with the Lehigh Study Council Study Tour, last week that focused on equity and excellence.
