 - Liberty Bell Elementary School School Performance Profile -90.7

All of the students and teachers from Liberty Bell, and a representative group of sixth graders and their teacher from the Intermediate School attended. Dr. Dumaresq congratulated our community, noting the importance of everyone working together and supporting education to student achievement.
