#### Course Description:

Full-Year Course - Grade 10 - 1.00 Credit. Required Sophomore Year.

This course is a graduation requirement for all tenth grade students not attending LCTI. Students learn software applications while creating and producing various business and career-related documents and products. Communication skills are practiced through group and individual project demonstrations and presentations. PA Career and Work Education standards and technology concepts are incorporated throughout the course. Students create an electronic and hard copy portfolio.

Students will participate in cyber safety activities and digital citizenship lessons to develop skills and awareness for responsible behavior as participants in the world's global network.
