

8th Grade Reading Seminar (018) 2014-2015

Course Description:

This course is designed to supplement and strengthen 8th grade students' reading, writing, and research skills. Students explore a variety of reading materials such as novels, informational articles, short stories, and plays used to expand reading skills, comprehension, and interest. This course also seeks to establish students' independent reading strategies that they can utilize in their content-area classes as well as in test-taking environments. Students will demonstrate these skills and strategies by creating literary analysis based on the reading materials. In addition, they will cite textual evidence to support their analysis. Another main component of this course is demonstrating their knowledge of research skills by completing various papers, projects, and assignments based on the content of the reading materials.

Course Content:

1.Fiction and Non-fiction

- a. Novels
- b. Articles
- c. Short stories
- d. Plays/Drama
- 2. Research and Presentation Skills
- 3. Metacognitive and Comprehension Activities
- 4. Test-taking Strategies
- 5. Shared Inquiry Discussion

Required Textbooks and/or Other Reading/Research Materials

1. All novels read in class will be provided at the onset of the unit, and will remain in the classroom.

Course Requirements:
