Piano I 2012-2013

Course Description:

This course is designed for the beginning student who wishes to learn the fundamentals of playing the piano. The student will demonstrate adequate motor skill development through the performance of a variety of sequential repertoire. Learning to read basic pitch and rhythmic patterns will be taught. A history of the instrument as well as its most famous composers and performers will be examined. The department of music's computer lab will be used for both individual and group instruction.

Course Content:

Basic notation reading Musical terminology

Music History as related to keyboard instruments and famous composers and/or performers Proper Playing Technique
