

## What is CHIP?

CHIP, short for the Children's Health Insurance Program, covers uninsured kids and teens up to age 19 who aren't eligible for Medical Assistance in Pennsylvania. It's easy to sign up, and even easier to qualify.

No matter why your kids don't have coverage right now – maybe you lost your job, or health care has gotten too expensive – CHIP may be able to help.

## Your uninsured kid may be eligible.

Based on your family's size and income, your child or teen may be eligible if he or she is:

- Under 19 years of age
- A U.S. citizen, U.S. national or qualified alien
- A resident of Pennsylvania
- Uninsured and not eligible for or enrolled in Medical Assistance

To keep your kids covered, you have to renew every year – it's not automatic, but it's easy. Your CHIP insurance company will send you a renewal form 90 days before your coverage ends, and they can help you through the process.

## Apply by Mail

You can print a copy of the application at **CHIPcoversPAkids.com**. Simply fill it out and mail it along with any necessary paperwork to the CHIP insurance company of your choice.

Or, you can call a CHIP insurance company listed on our website to request an application. They will be happy to send you one and help answer your questions.

- Your total household income before taxes (including wages, child support, unemployment, etc.)
- Social Security number of household members who are applying for CHIP
- Birth dates of household members
- Current or recent health insurance information, if applicable
- Proof of citizenship or legal residency of applicant (if not a U.S. citizen)

**It's easy! You can apply online or by mail.**  
**Applications take approximately 4-6 weeks to process.**

## In most cases, CHIP is free.

Most kids receive CHIP for free. Others can get the same benefits at a low cost. If you make too little to qualify for CHIP, your child or teen may be enrolled in Medical Assistance.
